



First of all welcome to Moore Hall! We are all very excited to have you as a new addition to our community here at K-State. Beginning college is a very exciting time full of questions and confusion, wonder and potential. We here at Moore Hall want move in to be as stress-free as possible and therefore have put together this “rough-guide” to assist in any questions that you may have. This is not an all inclusive guide but a nice reminder and a good starting resource.

Moore is a coeducational hall which houses 635 men and women amongst 9 floors including two Academic cluster floors for Business Administration (4th) and Leadership (6th) and an intensive study floor (9th). Amenities within the hall include a 24-Hour Front Desk, Computer lab, Laundry Facilities, Music Room, TV Room, Game Tables, Study Rooms, an Exercise/Weight Room and 24-Hour convenience store.

First year residents can expect to be in a double occupancy room and have a roommate. Each room includes standard residential hall furniture: bed, dresser, desk and closet area. While no furniture in the rooms may be removed, each piece can be moved around to personalize the room and additional furniture may be brought in. Typical sizes of each piece are included below as an outline to help you get an idea.

Room Assignments: Rooms are assigned at check-in, and rooms do differ somewhat but we hope this helps in planning on what to bring. We have done our best to provide as much information as possible but we are unable to provide you with a room number until you arrive. We are still making changes and assigning specific rooms up until move in to provide you with the best experience possible.

Beds: We have brand new beds in Moore Hall. The southwestern style beds are adjustable and loft-able and have up to 65” of space from the bottom of the frame to the floor and use a Twin XL Mattress. This eliminates the need for lofts and allows for a more fully customizable living space. These beds can either be bunked, lofted or set at any height in-between. If you will be living in Moore Hall you do not need to bring or purchase a loft since the furniture that is already in the room is loft-able.

Dressers: Every room now has the new style of dressers in Moore. Each room comes with two medium dressers with three spacious drawers (each roommate gets their own dresser).

Closets: There are closets in each room which are 3’ wide, 18” deep with a clothes bar 5’ up. These include a storage space above that is 2’ deep and 25” high. Additional built in and adjustable 15” wide and 34” tall storage shelves are on the same wall. Each double occupancy room has two closets and two built in shelf spaces.

Desks: Each roommate will of course have a desk and chair. Depending on floor you will have one of the two new styles of desks in Moore. They vary slightly in style and size, but each desk has built in drawers for storage and organization.

There are so many ways to get involved on campus in Moore with our HGB being just one of them. Each floor has its own governing board, we have a tour team, plenty of intramural sports and the list goes on.

If you are looking to earn a little bit of pocket money we have opportunities for that as well. Moore Hall employs a front desk staff, where the job is just as much about fun as it is working. Plus, who can beat a commute to work that consists of walking down the stairs? Derby Dining Center and the Derby Academic Resource Centers are always hiring as well. Working on campus works well with your studies and schedule too, so if you have a big test coming up or family coming to visit there is flexibility to get time off when you need it.

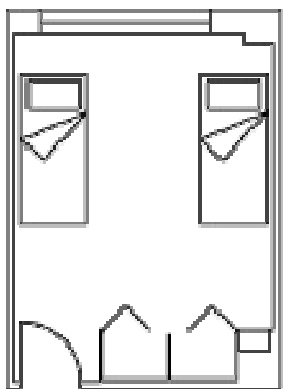
We really hope this has helped to answer any questions you may have had. If there is anything else we can do for you please contact either of us at Moore Hall.
