Learn how you can help your student be successful.

We're excited that your student has chosen to live on campus! Please read this guide carefully to help make the move a great experience.

PEOPLE YOU WILL MEET

Knowing where to go and who can answer your questions is an important first step toward making the experience in our residence halls as rewarding as possible for your student. There's an extensive network of people anticipating their arrival.

COMMUNITY ASSISTANT (CA): A CA is a student who lives in the hall and works at the hall's front desk. The CAs are there to provide customer service to the residents and visitors 24 hours a day.

RESIDENT ASSISTANT (RA): An RA is an undergraduate student who lives on your student's floor and has been selected and trained to assist and support them. RAs ensure university policies are followed, help floor members get acquainted by arranging occasional social and educational programs, and lend a listening ear to residents.

RESIDENTIAL LEARNING ASSISTANT (RLA): An RLA is an undergraduate student who acts as a peer mentor in a Residential CAT Community and supports students' academic and social development during their first year at K-State. RLAs live in a residence hall near the students in their CAT Community.

ASSISTANT COMMUNITY COORDINATOR (ACC): An ACC is a graduate student who assists the Community Coordinator in the day-to-day operation of the hall. ACCs live in the hall and supervise the hall front desk operation.

COMMUNITY COORDINATOR (CC): A CC is a full-time staff member who oversees the administration of the hall and its activities. CCs live in the hall and supervise the ACCs, RAs and CAs.

FACILITIES MANAGEMENT STAFF: These staff members are responsible for cleaning and maintaining the hall and its systems. Please have your student report any concerns to their hall's front desk or their RA.

MOVE-IN CREW: Volunteers who help transfer belongings from car to room on the busiest move-in days: Sunday, Aug. 18; Friday, Aug. 23; and Saturday, Aug. 24.

MOVE-IN DAY

We encourage you to bring a dolly/hand truck, as moving cart availability will be limited.

When you arrive at your student's hall, you will be asked to send your student to the front desk to complete paperwork and receive their room keys.

Someone should stay with your vehicle and begin unloading.

We ask that you unload everything at once on the sidewalk or grass.

Once you've unloaded, we ask that your vehicle be moved to the outer lots or away from the residence halls to allow other families to begin the move-in process.

Some halls have a move-in crew that will assist you.

This day can present unique stresses. You may experience tension as you try to help your student and they try to show independence. You're not alone! Don't wait until move-in day to talk with your student about this transition.

You'll receive more information about move-in — including traffic flow and parking — by mail in late July or early August.

PET POLICY INFO

In order to protect the rights of all residents, ensure humane treatment of pets and meet sanitation requirements, there is a pet policy in place for the residence halls. This pet policy does not include assistance animals.

The pet policy outlines the types of pets and habitats allowed, guidelines for the care of pets, the pet approval process, and other considerations. The full policy can be found at housing.k-state.edu/living-options/reshalls/resources.

In general, no more than two pet habitats per resident are allowed, and habitats are limited to 30 gallon tanks. Preapproval by all roommates and the Community Coordinator is required before move-in day. If preapproval is not met before move-in day, there is a one week waiting period before the pet can enter the residence hall.

what not to bring

Air conditioner or space heater
Halogen lamp with exposed bulb
Open flame devices (e.g., candles, incense, incense burner)
Appliances with an open or closed heating element (e.g., toaster, toaster oven, hot plate, grilling appliance, sandwich maker, etc.)
Illegal or unauthorized materials (e.g., alcohol, drugs, fireworks, explosives, stolen property, weapons as outlined in university weapons policy PPM 3770)
Unapproved pets (see pet policy info)



COMPLETING EMERGENCY AND CONFIDENTIAL CONTACT INFORMATION ONLINE

Prior to move-in, you will need to complete the emergency and confidential contact information form found at *apps2.housing.k-state. edu/contacts.* This information is accessible to Housing and Dining Services staff to communicate with designated individuals in the event of an emergency.

The form also covers student behavior expectations while living on campus. Students are responsible for reading the Residence Life Handbook and are responsible for abiding by the policies outlined within. The handbook can be found online at housing.k-state.edu/living-options/reshalls/resources.

SMOKE-FREE CAMPUS

As of June 1,2018, Kansas State University is a smoke-free campus. The smoking of cigarettes, cigars, pipes or burning tobacco in any other form or device, as well as the use of electronic cigarettes, vaporizers, hookah, or other water pipe devices and all other related devices, is prohibited in university-owned vehicles and on university property, except inside personal vehicles. University property includes: inside buildings and structures, outdoors, and within state-owned vehicles. For more information about this policy, visit k-state.edu/vpaf/cleanair.

SERVICES



PARKING

If your student chooses to bring a vehicle to K-State, they will need to purchase a parking permit from Parking Services (pre-order before move-in at *k-state.edu/parking*). Most first-year students receive an R permit. Spaces in lots directly adjacent to residence halls are assigned on a seniority-based point system.

LAUNDRY

A laundry facility is available in each residence hall. To use the washing machines or dryers, students will need to activate the machines by swiping their K-State ID cards through the card reader in the laundry facility. Laundry prices are \$1.50 for each wash and dry. Charges for laundry will be deducted from the student's Cat Cash account (learn more at union.k-state.edu/services/cat-cash).

LAFENE HEALTH CENTER

Lafene is an on-campus health center available to all students. Lafene is a quick and convenient place for students to receive quality care. A full-service pharmacy is also available for prescriptions and non-prescriptions. Visit Lafene online at *k-state.edu/lafene* for more information.

COMPUTERS AND INTERNET ACCESS

Wired and wireless internet access is available in all housing communities. The Wi-Fi network can get congested during peak hours, so we recommend using a wired (Ethernet) connection if possible—it's a good idea to buy an Ethernet cable before arriving on campus. Hubs to split Ethernet jacks are available for free checkout. Laser printing is available for a small charge at hall front desks and the Jardine Apartments office.

K-Staters connecting their computers to the Kansas State University network can use the antivirus software of their choice or choose from the recommended software found at *k-state.edu/its/antivirus*.

Don't buy: wireless router (not permitted), wireless-only printer (bring a USB cable to hook up), Chromecast or similar "casting" media streamer (Roku boxes with Ethernet connection work well for Netflix, Hulu, etc.) and Microsoft Office (free for students). Please note that Xbox One multiplayer gaming is problematic on campus, so we recommend the Playstation 4 if that is an option.

Residents have their own technology help desk, the ResNet Help Desk, located on the first floor of the Kramer Center.

SERVICE FEES

INTERNET/ETHERNET CONNECTION

The use of both wired and wireless Internet connections is included in the residence hall contract fees.

ROOM ASSIGNMENTS AND ROOMMATE(S)

HOW ASSIGNMENTS ARE MADE

When a residence hall contract has been submitted along with the minimum payment, your student may enter our Resident Portal and select a space from the available options. Students enrolled in a Residential CAT Community are given priority. Students may select their own roommates or have roommates assigned to the available space(s) in their room of choice. We also offer RoomSync (housing.k-state.edu/living-options/reshalls/roomsync.html), a program through which users create a roommate-matching profile as part of the Facebook app. Students can search for roommates until they find a good fit. Room or roommate changes can be made in the Resident Portal before July 1. (Residential CAT Community students should contact Housing and Dining Services staff for assistance with these changes.)

CONTACTING ROOMMATES FOR THE FIRST TIME

Meeting and living with a new roommate is an exciting event that can enhance your student's college experience. We encourage each student to contact their new roommate(s) as soon as possible, which will allow them to get to know each other and coordinate what each will bring.

ROOMMATES FROM AROUND THE WORLD

Your student may be placed in housing with a student from another country. Prior to their arrival at K-State, we encourage students to begin conversations about their future roommate's home and culture. An effort to understand each other from the start will set the foundation for a positive and memorable oncampus living experience.

EARLY ARRIVALS

The residence halls officially open for occupancy at 10 a.m. Saturday, Aug. 24. For a variety of reasons, some students need to be on campus before this date. For an additional daily fee of \$45, which covers housing and three meals each day, students may move in to their permanent assignments anytime after 10 a.m. Sunday, Aug. 18. Charges are billed to the student's KSIS account and do not need to be paid the day you arrive. Contracts for students who arrive early begin when they check in to the residence halls. No special arrangement or prior approval is needed. Meal service begins with breakfast on Monday, Aug. 19.

FACILITY INFO

Loftable/bunkable beds, extra-long twin mattresses, desks, chairs, trash cans, recycling bins, and dressers or built-in drawers are provided in each residence hall room.

Modifications to the electrical, lighting or mechanical systems are not allowed. All furniture provided, including bed frame and mattress, must remain in the room, but additional pieces may be added as space allows.

K-STATE ASSOCIATION OF RESIDENCE HALLS (ARH) FUNDRAISERS

The K-State Association of Residence Halls (ARH) sponsors two programs and services that serve as fundraisers to support the many programs and activities your student can participate in while living in our halls. Only the following programs, through On Campus Marketing (OCM), are sponsored.

DERBY DINING CENTER RENOVATION INFORMATION

RENOVATION TAKING PLACE DURING THE 2019-2020 ACADEMIC YEAR

Housing and Dining Services is excited to announce that renovation of Derby Dining Center will take place during summer 2019 and the 2019-2020 academic year.

The renovation will include a new entry on the southeast corner of the building, updates to the first floor, a new single staircase entry to the food service area and a new open dining experience on the second floor. Updated fire safety and heat and air systems will be installed as well.

Derby will continue to serve meals to students during the renovation, though certain lines and menu concepts may be limited and pathways to and through the dining center may change as progress is made.

Housing and Dining Services will work closely with our contractors to minimize the disruption to students while maximizing communication of important information during the process.

	Check your email and watch for a mailer in early August regarding more detailed move-in information, including traffic flow and parking.
	Reach out to your Community Coordinator or the main Housing and Dining Services office (see back page for contact information) with any questions prior to move-in.
	If bringing pets, complete the pet policy form, obtain signatures from roommates and submit to your Community Coordinator prior to move-in.
	If bringing a vehicle, purchase a residence hall parking pass at www.k-state.edu/parking.
	If bringing a bicycle, complete the free registration form at www.k-state.edu/parking/forms/bicycle.html to receive your bicycle permit.
